



HOW TO WRITE A GOOD POSITION PAPER



1. READ YOUR BACKGROUND PAPER

Ensure that you have a clear understanding of the topic and can identify the main idea.





2. RESEARCH

Undertake a detailed investigation into the issue, with special emphasis on its effects on your delegation. We strongly encourage you to research extensively to prepare your position paper and equip yourself for the debate.



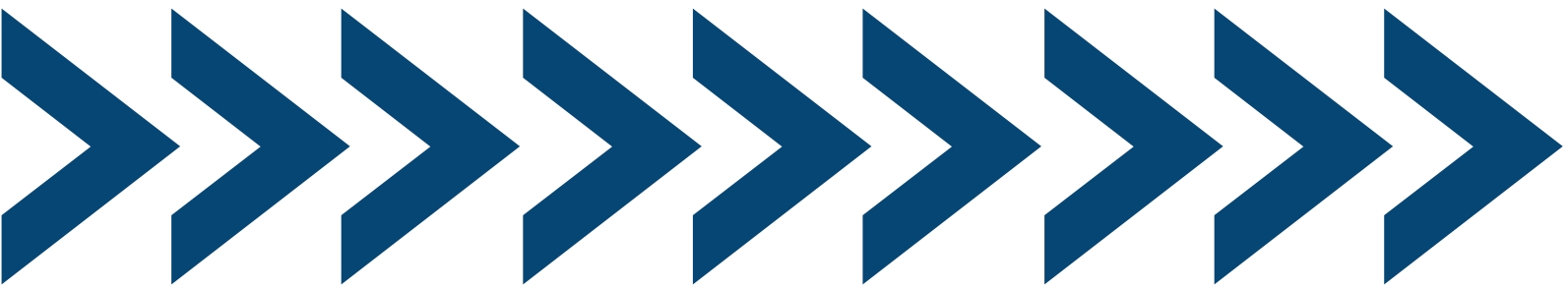


3. START WRITING!

Start by writing your delegation's name, your school, your name, and the topic at the top of your document.

4. INTRODUCTION

Introduce the topic by discussing its definition, causes, effects etc. While we encourage you to be detailed, a single paragraph is enough to introduce the problem.



5. WRITE ABOUT YOUR DELEGATION'S POSITION

What is their stance on the issue? Have they implemented any laws regarding the issue? It's important for your position to be clear and straightforward so that other delegations understand where your country stands during the debate.





6. SOLUTIONS

Develop efficient solutions to address the problem at hand. Try to specify your solutions as much as possible, including details such as who will finance it, where it will take place, how it will be implemented, and who will contribute.
