WHAT IS MODEL UNITED NATIONS?

A Model United Nations (MUN) is an academic conference where students immerse themselves in the study of diplomacy and global affairs. In these simulations, participants act as a representative of a country, organization, or person, collaborating with peers to solve real-world problems. This role is why they are called delegates. Engaging in discussions on international challenges allows students to gain insight into current global conflicts while simultaneously developing skills in critical thinking, teamwork, and leadership.

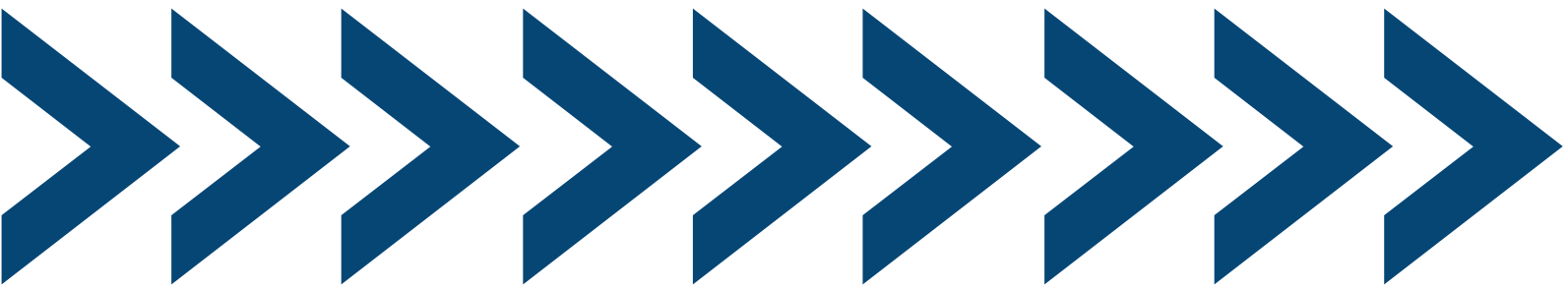

HOW CAN I REGISTER AS A DELEGATE?

Our registration process is highly examined, therefore, registration is handled exclusively through teachers, advisors, and/or MUN directors.



WHAT DOES THE REGISTRATION FEE COVER?

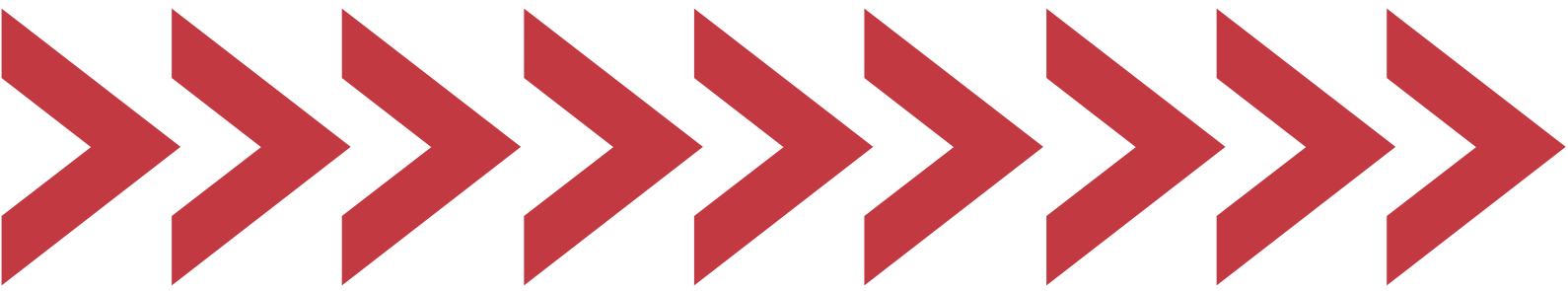
Limun's registration fee covers the entire event. This includes two conferences with prominent speakers, the delegates' party, meals and snacks, and optional Sunday excursions and workshops.



WHERE DO PARTICIPANTS COME FROM?

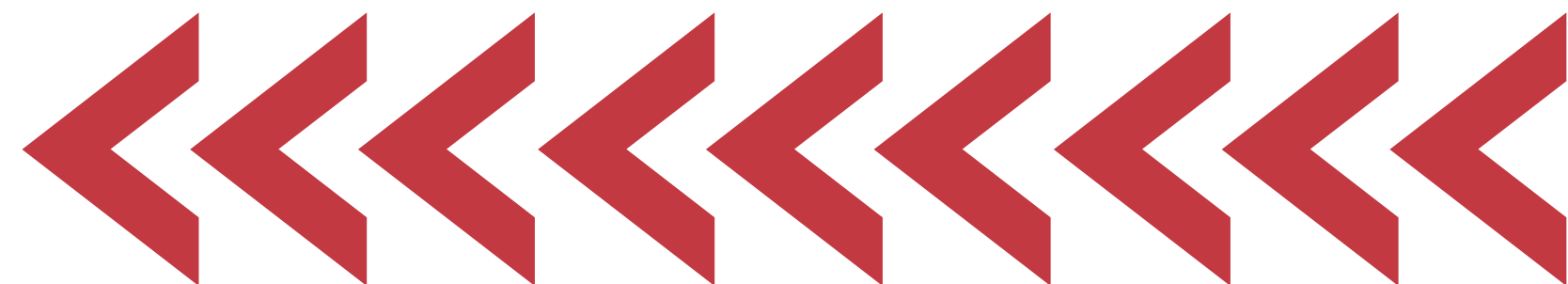
Limun participants come primarily from the metropolitan area of Monterrey, Mexico. However, we also receive delegates from various parts of the country including Mexico City, Guadalajara, Sonora, Sinaloa, Baja California, Puebla, Quintana Roo, etc.





WHAT MEALS DOES THIS FEE COVER?

Students will be provided with snacks and beverages during breaks, along with Saturday lunch and both days will be provided with dinner.

WHAT IS THE EXPECTED WEATHER?

As January is the coldest month in Monterrey, the weather can vary anywhere from 5° C to 22° C. However, it's important to keep in mind that the temperature changes very fast in this city, so we would strongly recommend that you check the weather forecast a few days prior.
