I. ABOUT THE COMMITTEE

INTERPOL IS is known as the biggest international law enforcement agency in the world. Driven by its Member States, its mission and operations are distinct from those of other international organizations. To support its three primary crime programs—counterterrorism, cybercrime, and organized and emergent crime—INTERPOL offers various policing knowledge and capacities.

Since 1996, INTERPOL has profited from a unique position as a Permanent Observer at the United Nations. This status, which was initially created by General Assembly Resolution 51/1, was confirmed in 1997 with a Cooperation Agreement.

INTERPOL, an international body with administrative authority, assists nations in cooperating to combat international criminal activity. Interpol officials cannot detain suspects or take action without the consent of national authorities since they lack governmental authority. In this sense, Interpol functions more as an administrative organization than an executive one. To assist the



national authorities in combating transborder crime, Interpol offers support and tools to its member states.
